Session 2 –

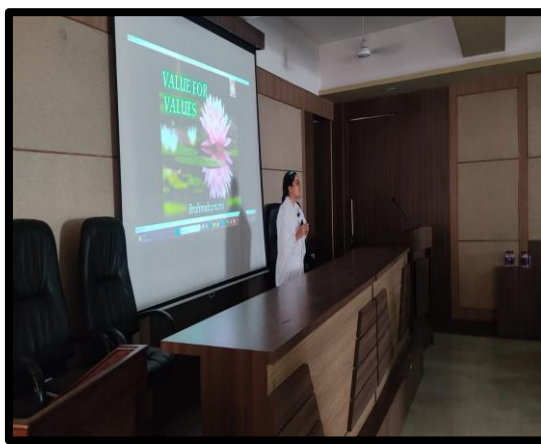
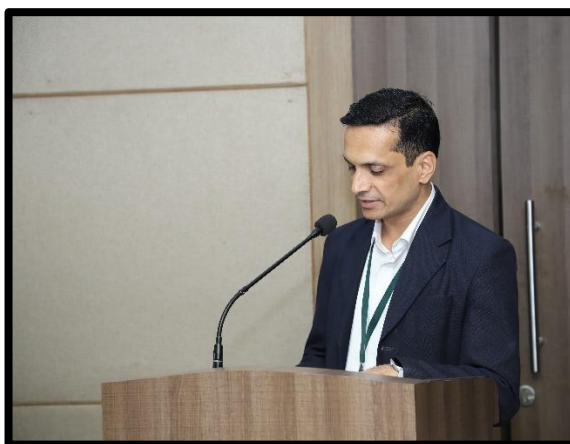

Ms. Shruti Seth, our Counselor, highlighted the significance of soft skills in the context of placements and career development.

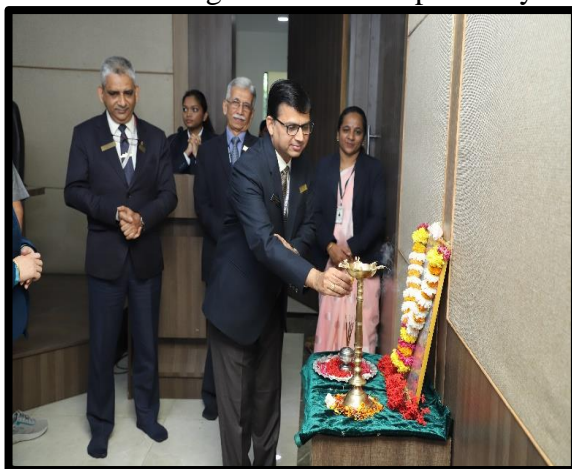
The CFO, Mr. Bipin Kumar shed light on the role of pharmacists in the healthcare industry.

Date: 04/09/2023

Session 1: Statutory requirements & its fulfilment

Session was conducted by Dr. Ashish Kulkarni on the topic statutory requirements and its fulfillment. He informed the faculty regarding the joining formalities, PCI registration, BCUD profile updation along with the maintenance of personal file. He also asked the faculties to complete all the formalities within a week of their joining with the help of college office.



Session 2: Familiarisation with college committees

Ms. Jyostna Chopade focused on the various duties and responsibilities of college working committees and the documents required to be maintained for the smooth functioning of the respective committee. She encouraged the newly joined faculty to identify their interest and come up with the name of committee they wish to work with.



Session 3: Academic & Exams – Rules and regulations alongwith TG details

Dr. Devendra Shirole started the session by discussing about the SPPU college academic calendar. Further sir explained about the workload distribution for faculties along with the time table discussion. He also highlighted the importance of maintaining the documents in the form of course booklet. Also, he introduced everyone to the various exam formats and the rules and regulations laid down by SPPU for the same. Sir also mentioned about the Tutor Guardian system available in college and the functioning of the same.



Session 4: Teaching and Pedagogy methods

Dr. Shilpa Chaudhari conducted a session on various teaching pedagogy methods. She explained about the different types of Teaching techniques, discussion of instructional techniques, pedagogy techniques, use of ICT, Game pedagogy, flipped classroom, problem-based learning, CO learning, e learning, role play etc. She also shared one game pedagogy with the faculty to have the actual classroom experience.



Session 5: CO-PO Mapping

The session on CO-PO mapping was conducted by Dr. Shilpa Chaudhari, wherein maam discussed about the importance of mapping. She explained what exactly is meant by outcome, difference between Course outcome and course objective, introduction to blooms taxanomy and revised blooms taxanomy, preparation of Course outcome statements and TLO statements based on blooms taxanomy, mapping of CO with PO, mapping of TLO with CO. She urged the faculty to prepare the same for their respective subjects and discuss with her in person.



Session 6: CO-PO Attainment

After understanding the mapping, Dr. Shubhangi Daswadkar conducted a session on CO-PO attainment. In this session ma'am focused on the different methods for evaluation of the Program outcomes attainment. She explained that all PO attainments are evaluated by Direct tools which include continuous assessment, Internal and External examination and indirect tools contain Graduate Exit Survey, Alumni Survey, Employer Survey and Parent Feedback. She explained the correlation between all these different tools and its interpretation.

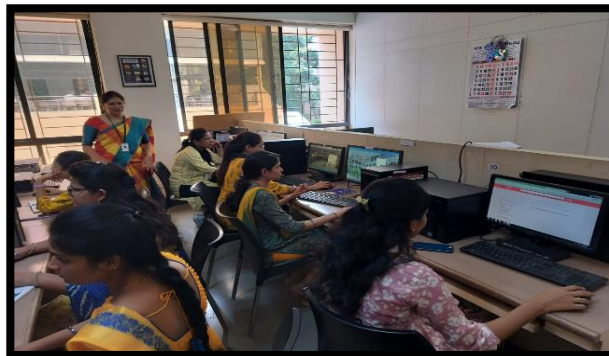
Session 8: Communication skills
